1. How would you describe the congregation's/organization's specific vision for ministry? How will this vision impact the community? Is the congregation part of a ministry vision or program?

We are a More Light, Matthew 25 church, offering all God's children opportunities to worship without feeling judged. We study, work, and show up in ways that help us understand what makes people feel valued, actively helping to strengthen and heal our vulnerable community. Our vision for ministry is to educate and eliminate our blind spots. We like to learn and welcome challenges. We find stability in traditional worship but are building traditions to be less patriarchal, less homophobic, less racist, and less ableist. We try to stay informed and responsive to the world around us, reaching out to ensure no one's voice is silenced. The result is a congregation that is disproportionately rich in opinions, shared wisdom, and deep, broad, busy compassion for our very small size. Our happiest members come for the music and smart sermons, and stay for the clean-up, for whatever that entails.

2. What is the nature and context of the community in which your congregation lives out its mission/vision? How will you address the emerging needs that are impacting your community?

The challenges in our own congregation reflect the challenges of the community around us, which include but are not limited to aging issues, health and disability concerns, and support for the marginalized and undocumented. Our church sign boldly displays a rainbow, publicly inviting ALL God's children. We keep food vouchers on hand for visitors in need, and are known for being an active, sometimes stubbornly vocal, visible presence in our Presbytery and our community. We feel called to set a table fed by Presbyterian traditions, to those who have not felt welcome in other worship cultures. We love and respect our denominational traditions without getting stuck in the past, providing a haven from raging culture wars outside. Although Covid made our robust community fragile, we continue to look for safe ways to adapt to remain close-knit and hands-on without spreading disease.

3. How will this call help complement the responsibilities of other staff/volunteer positions, and the life of the congregation/organization, so that you may accomplish your short and long-term goals for ministry?

We are a smattering of devoted volunteers searching for a capable, organized leader who will stay ahead of our congregation's plans. A leader who is comfortable communicating outstanding needs to the congregation, encouraging us to volunteer for much needed tasks, and reminding members of expected obligations to the service of others. Our minister must be excited to learn and willing to share that learning with us. As a mission-oriented congregation, it is imperative that our leader is one who shares our passion for missions, guiding us to tangible mission programs to match our values and abilities, such as outreach for the homeless who are mentally ill.

4. Provide a description of the skills, gifts and training the person you hope will become a part of your ministry must have, to lead the congregation towards the vision and mission established.

Our minister must be progressive, accepting of a wide variety of people and beliefs including, but not limited to our LGBTQIA+ siblings in Christ. Many of our congregants, deriving from other or non-faith traditions, have made their home here because of our affirming, accepting, and loving community.

Our minister must be organized, knowledgeable of church administration, preaching wellprepared sermons informed by Scripture to offer creative challenges for spiritual seekers. They should be intellectually curious, possessing an avid willingness to teach, as well as a humble excitement to learn, comfortably working alongside strong lay leadership and worship planning committees.

The Lectionary must be their guide in providing informed service order, sermon scriptures and themes. It is imperative that they present good listenership, enthusiastically acquainting themselves with the congregation and its needs.

They should be considerate and compassionate, but also able to establish and maintain boundaries. They should be attentive to the larger Presbyterian church.

We want someone who is searching for a long-term, permanent position.

 - Collaborate with the music program and lay leaders in developing inspirational worship services relating to today's world.
 - Teach a weekly children's sermon.

 - Manage church calendar, provide information to staff and congregation in a timely manner.
 - Provide guidance/direction for all volunteers and lay leaders.
 - Oversee church website/social media.
 - Moderate monthly Session meetings.
 - Provide guidance to the Deacons.
 - o Occasional newsletter.
- Pastoral Care:
 - Visit and/or communicate with those that are in the hospital, homebound, in crisis, or in any other kind of need.
 - Perform memorial services.
 - Conduct weddings and funerals.
 - Deliver sacraments to the homebound on a quarterly basis.
- Education:
 - Lead adult education classes.
 - Provide new member/inquirer classes.
 - Teach confirmation classes (usually 1-2 children per year).
 - Provide guidance for all educational programs.
- Stewardship:

- Inspire and challenge the congregation to be faithful stewards of their time, talents, and financial resources.
