### **Course Description**

This course serves as an introductory study of the history, theology, and practice of Christian worship. Attention will be given to biblical, theological, historical, and practical foundations of worship, including the sacraments. Within these larger categories of worship, the course will also introduce topics of space, language, and time. Students will be guided in the practice of liturgical leadership and will reflect on their roles as worship leaders.

### **Course Objectives**

- Gain a critical and integrative understanding of the history, theology, structure, and contemporary practice of Christian worship, including an introduction to the relationship between Word and act in the leading of public worship.
- Gain a critical appreciation of one's own tradition along with attention to the larger church and contemporary trends in worship and theology.
- Equip candidates for ministry with both practical and analytical tools to provide informed worship leadership in today's congregations.
- Introduce issues of ethics and leadership which grow out of the ministry of Word and Sacrament.

- Be formed by, live in, and minister out of scripture and the historical and theological tradition of the church.
- Lead worship and administer the sacraments with theological integrity and to the glory of God.
- Educate and equip individuals and congregations to live and minister joyfully and faithfully as part of their own denomination and the ecumenical church.
