OVERVIEW/COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course introduces the historical, literary, and cultural background and theological content of the Old Testament in light of the Reformed tradition.

This course is a required course for the M.A.R.T.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

By participating fully in this class, students will be able to:

- 1. Outline the basic storyline of the Old Testament and to identify major genres, characters and key passages.
- 2. Identify and to articulate key theological themes in the Old Testament especially as interpreted in the Reformed tradition.
- 3. Analyze key passages in the Old Testament and explain how they function in the canon and within the Reformed tradition.
- 4. Grow in their ability to interpret Scripture for the life of the Christian community.

M.A.R.T. Curricular Goals Fulfilled by This Course:

- Identify and articulate the core commitments of the Christian tradition with a focus on the Reformed tradition
- Analyze how key theological terms and concepts emerged and function within the Christian tradition and, more specifically, the Reformed tradition
- Describe and evaluate the core commitments of the catholic and Reformed tradition in conversation with historical and contemporary critics.
