MN 564: Theological and Biblical Research

1 Credit

Course Description

Students learn research and reading techniques that will help them succeed in Seminary. At the completion of the course, students will be able to use research tools such as the library catalog and *ATLA Religion Database* to create a bibliography in Turabian (University of Chicago) format on a topic relevant to their Seminary education and they will become familiar with biblical reference tools. Students also learn how to analyze academic texts for relevance to their topic.

Course Objectives

Students will learn to:

- 1. Navigate the library catalog, *ATLA Religion Database*, and a variety of electronic and print sources to find information on a topic relevant to their Seminary education.
- 2. Analyze academic texts for relevance to a research topic.
- 3. Compile a bibliography in Turabian (University of Chicago) format
- 4. Navigate biblical reference works, such as dictionaries, encyclopedias, and commentaries.
