

Course Description

This course serves as an introductory study of the history, theology, and practice of Christian worship. Attention will be given to biblical, theological, historical, and practical foundations of worship. Within these larger categories of worship, the course will also introduce topics of space, language, and time.



Course Objectives

- ➤ Demonstrate a critical and integrative understanding of the history, theology, structure, and contemporary practice of Christian worship, including an introduction to the relationship between Word and act in the leading of public worship.
- ➤ Demonstrate a critical appreciation of one's own tradition along with attention to the larger church and contemporary trends in worship and theology.
- Demonstrate practical and analytical tools for providing informed worship leadership in today's congregations.
- Examine issues of ethics and leadership that grow out of the ministry of Word and sacrament.
